FLE has also organised and provided various intensive onsite training programmes to public sector organisations and firms in the past year to develop and improve their controls and systems so as to ensure effective compliance with financial crime laws and regulations. Registered experts from the company also provided technical assistance to different firms to develop their risk portfolio by assessing various risks facing the firm and to update and improve the firm's internal controls and systems to efficiently detect and prevent potential financial crimes.

FLE (previously known as 'FLE Legal Education') was established in 2005 as the foremost provider of the Qualified Lawyers Transfer Test (QLTT) in the Indian Sub-Continent, and was set up with the support of the Law Society of England and Wales and the British High Commissioner, New Delhi. QLTT was conducted in India by FLE in conjunction with Central Law Training (CLT), UK, and successful completion allows practising Indian lawyers to be admitted to the Roll of Solicitors of the Supreme Court of England and Wales. The programme was launched in India to allow Indian lawyers to take this test while in their home country.

Welcome and Opening Remarks by Dr. Frieder Lempp, Lecturer, Massey University.

Short Profile of Dr. Frieder Lempp:

Dr Frieder Lempp is the Acting Director of the Dispute Resolution Centre at Massey University. In this role he provides academic and educational leadership to Massey University's dispute resolution programme. The center is located in New Zealand's largest AACSB accredited Business School. Its courses are accredited by the professional body for arbitrators and mediators in New Zealand.

Frieder holds a Ph.D. and B.A. (Honours) in Logic from Victoria University of Wellington and an M.A. in Logic, Psychology, and Mathematics from the University of Leipzig. He has completed training courses in mediation with LEADR/IAMA and is an affiliate member of the Arbitrators and Mediators Institute New Zealand (AMINZ).

Frieder's research specialisation is in the development of computational models of negotiation and conflict resolution. He has accomplished publications in this area in top-ranked journals and has presented papers at numerous national and international conferences. His wider research interests include the role of consensual processes (e.g. negotiation, facilitation, mediation) regarding the constructive resolution and/or management of disputes and the use and provision of such processes by government agencies.

Apart from his research, Frieder thoroughly enjoys teaching. He is an experienced lecturer in negotiation and mediation at all levels. In his teaching, he frequently employs role-play techniques and makes use of innovative forms of learning (e.g. web-based learning, flipped classroom, scaffolding techniques). In 2014, he was nominated Lecturer of the Year by the Massey University Students' Association.

Frieder's teaching and research are informed by his professional activity as an accredited mediator and his policy experience in both the German and New Zealand public sector. Prior to working in academia he held positions with the New Zealand Treasury and the German Federal Foreign Office. He regularly conducts mediations as part of Massey University's Mediation Service.
