QLTT was conducted in India by FLE in conjunction with Central Law Training (CLT), UK, and successful completion allows practising Indian lawyers to be admitted to the Roll of Solicitors of the Supreme Court of England and Wales. The programme was launched in India to allow Indian lawyers to take this test while in their home country.

Keynote Speech by Prof. Sanjeev Sobhee, Professor, University of Mauritius, *Inflation Aversion and Endogenous Political Parties in a Model of Delegated Monetary Policy Making*

Short Profile of Prof Sanjeev K Sobhee:

Sanjeev K Sobhee is Professor of Applied Economics and Development Studies at the Faculty of Social Studies and Humanities, University of Mauritius, where he has been affiliated for over 20 years now. Prof Sobhee has also served as Dean of Faculty and Chair of the Department of Economics and Statistics during these years. He has been lecturing on Advanced Macroeconomics, Public Policy, Economics of the Environment and Sustainable Development and Quantitative Methods. All along, he has served as Programme Co-ordinators for several undergraduate and postgraduate courses at his university. Currently, his research areas include, amongst others, theoretical and applied economics, development issues, macroeconomics of the environment, sustainable development policies. In recent years, Prof Sobhee has been focusing on climate change and its implications, particularly, for small island states. He has published extensively in internationally refereed journals such as Journal of Economic Policy Forum, Oxford Development Studies, Canadian Journal of Development Studies, American Review of Political Economy, Development Southern Africa, Applied Economics Letters, Ocean and Coastal Management and Environmental Management. In addition, Prof Sanjeev Sobhee has consulted on quite a few projects for various international institutions, namely, The World Bank, United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), Food and Agricultural Organisation (FAO), International Organisation for Migration (IOM), United Nations Conference on Trade and Development (UNCTAD), Southern African Development Community (SADC). Among some of the completed projects, he has been working on Green Fiscal Policy Making, Migration and Climate Change, Socio-economic Consequences of Alcohol Abuse and Household Indebtedness in Mauritius. At present, he is leading a project on social protection of women entrepreneurs in the informal sector, a project funded by the Mauritius Research Council, Government of Mauritius.
