The programme was launched in India to allow Indian lawyers to take this test while in their home country.

**Short Profile of Prof. Mohammad Ishtiaque**

Professor Mohammad Ishtiaque, Ph.D. is the Vice-Chancellor of Magadh University, Bodhgaya, Bihar (India). Having an experience of 32 years of teaching in the post-graduate Department of Geography, Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi, Professor Ishtiaque has got a credit of writing 10 books (6 authored, 1 co-authored and 3 edited) and 50 articles published in Journals of National and International repute.

Professor Ishtiaque studied at Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU), New Delhi for his graduate degrees including M.A., M.Phil and Ph.D. His academic interests include social geography focusing on linguistic geography, urban geography and cartography. He has been a recipient of merit scholarship throughout his academic career.

Professor Ishtiaque has organized/coordinated 17 conferences successfully, Chaired 39 technical sessions in seminars/conferences, presented 43 research papers in conference/ seminars and delivered 25 special lectures in different occasions in colleges and universities.

Professor Ishtiaque is an active researcher who has conducted 10 research projects including 5 national and another 5 with the collaboration of Hiroshima University, Japan. The domestic projects were funded by University Grants Commission (UGC), Indian Council of Social Sciences and Research (ICSSR) and Delhi Minorities Commission. Oxford's magic has inspired generations of creative writers, some of them internationally famous, like J.R.R. Tolkien and C.S. Lewis, others known to a more restricted but discerning readership, like Philip Larkin and Beerbohm himself. Literary walking tour evokes many of these unique personalities and shows you the places where they studied and relaxed, were rapt by religious fervour, composed in mad erotic delirium, or drifted away into dreams of other worlds and other days. Our guides, noted literary experts, will take you round the centre of "that sweet city... with her dreaming spires" as Matthew Arnold phrased it, and give you a genuine flavour of Oxford's glorious literary past, and her vibrant present. Colleges will be visited so that the living atmosphere of the university, jealously preserved through long centuries, can be experienced just as it was by the writers themselves. The tour lasts for an hour and a half, giving plenty of time to wander and savour the delights of the 'English Athens': its halls, chapels, cloisters, and gardens which, as W.H. ## **Information about the The Queen's College – Conference Venue**

The "Hall of the Queen's Scholars at Oxford" was founded in 1341 by Robert de Eglesfield, a chaplain in the household of Queen Philippa, who named it in her honour. He envisaged an establishment of fellows, chaplains, 'poor boys' and various officials and servants, headed by a Provost. Membership was to be open, but with a preference for inhabitants of Cumberland and Westmorland.

Initially Queen's was a poor College, but the endowments slowly grew. Crucially, in 1343, Queen Philippa secured for Queen's the lands of a small hospital in Southampton, destined to be the basis of much of the College's prosperity in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries as Southampton Docks expanded and surrounding farmland was developed. Several other Queens of England have played a significant role in our history.

Parts of the current College date back to the 17th century and replace the earlier medieval College buildings that had fallen into disrepair in the 16th century. The College is one of the oldest constituent  
Created at 24/05/2016 13:42:00 Colleges of the University of Oxford.

Many of the original statutes for the College are still followed today, including such traditional observances as the summoning of the Members of the College to dinner by a trumpet call. Throughout the year the College observes feasts of the Church, including the All Saints' Gaudy on All Saints' Day, the famous Boar's Head Gaudy just before Christmas and the Needle and Thread Gaudy shortly after New Year's Day.
